Lawrence A. Lamb, DVM, veterinarian at the Manchester Veterinary Clinic has been chosen by the Angell Animal Medical Center in Boston to be a referral consultant. He will be sharing information about the newer technologies and medical advances at the Angell Animal Medical Center with other veterinarians and private veterinary practices and enhancing communication between Angell and the professionals it serves.

Dr. Lamb's extensive experience in Veterinary Medicine includes owning and managing multiple veterinary facilities, authoring a column, editing a veterinary textbook and being recognized for thought and organizational leadership within his profession and among his peers. His primary interest is using his experience to benefit his clients and advancing the profession of Veterinary Medicine.

Dr. Lamb continues his full time participation in the Manchester Veterinary Clinic, specializing in personal care. Like most animal hospitals, Dr. Lamb's Manchester Veterinary Clinic provides routine care, vaccinations, soft tissue and certain kinds of orthopedic surgery, dentistry, ultrasound and x-rays. However, for advanced treatments such as radiation therapy, advanced imaging like MRI's and other cutting edge technologies and treatments, Dr. Lamb has collaborated with Angell Animal Medical Center for more than 15 years. This appointment is an evolution of the relationship that developed over time.

At Angell Animal Medical Center there are 80 full time veterinarians committed to providing the best overall health care for the 50,000 patients treated each year. Most of the patients come as referrals from Animals Hospitals in New England. AAMC also provides training for graduate veterinarians and develops new knowledge in the diagnosis and treatment of companion animal diseases.
